WELCOME TO CCSU!

This handbook will ensure that you are well prepared for your arrival to campus

MANDATORY ORIENTATION

All international students must attend the **mandatory** immigration orientation provided by ISSS. Details will be emailed to you before your arrival. The orientation will provide you with information on how to maintain legal status in the U.S. It is also an opportunity to ask questions and meet fellow international students.

Documents that you MUST bring to Orientation:

- Passport
- Current Form I-20 (for F-1 students)
- Current Form DS-2019 (exchange students, J-1)
- Any previous Form I-20
- I-94 card (Available to print at https://i94.cbp.dhs.gov after your entry to the U.S.)
- Any other relevant immigration documents (transfer forms, approval notices, etc.)

THESE DOCUMENTS ARE YOUR GOLD. Make sure to keep them in your hand luggage on your travel here. You will also need to show these documents at the point of entry to the United States.

ARRIVING IN THE U.S.




DO NOT ENTER THE U.S. ON A B-1/B-2 VISITOR VISA

Special note for Canadian students: Non-immigrant travelers on a Canadian passport are not required to have a visa and may enter the U.S. with only a valid Form I-20 and passport.

Students are responsible for making their own travel plans to CCSU. If you have signed up for on-campus housing and arrive to the States earlier than the designated Move-In dates, you will have to **make** alternate over-night accommodation.

ARRIVING TO CAMPUS

Depending on which airport you are arriving to, there are different ways to get to CCSU.

<u>Uber</u> is a taxi service that is available to and from all airports in the U.S. It is a great choice for shorter distances but may be too pricy for longer travels. Download the app ahead of your arrival to the U.S. for your own convenience.

<u>Lyft</u> is another service just like Uber.





For longer distances, you will want to arrange your trip ahead. Connecticut has a developed train system that takes you across the State.

CCSU's closest train station is Hartford Union Station. From there, you can take a bus or an Uber to CCSU.

Get to Grand Central Station, NY, by <u>preferable</u> <u>means</u>. From there, access <u>train</u> or <u>bus</u> to Hartford Union Station.

Newark Liberty International Airport (EWR)

Newark Airport's <u>AirTrain</u> service takes you to the nearest Amtrak Station where you can take the train to Hartford Union Station.

Duration of trip: 3.5+ hrs

Laguardia International Airport (LGA)

Get to Grand Central Station, NY, by <u>preferable</u> <u>means</u>. From there, access <u>train</u> or <u>bus</u> to Hartford Union Station.

Logan Airport offers free shuttle to South Station. Go from South Station to Hartford Union by, <u>Amtrak Train, Peter Pan Bus</u>, or <u>Greyhound Bus</u> Duration of trip: 3.5+ hrs

<u>Airport Regional Rail</u> takes you to Philadelphia Amtrak station where you can take the <u>train</u> to Hartford Union Station.

HOUSING

ON-CAMPUS HOUSING

F-1 students must apply for on-campus housing with Residence Life. Find all information you need including, deadlines, deposits, and application process at www.ccsu.edu/reslife

J-1 students (exchange students), please submit your housing application along with your CCSU Exchange Student application.

NOTE: students remaining on campus during breaks must notify ResLife ahead and will be charged extra.

OFF-CAMPUS HOUSING

Students who wish to reside off-campus are responsible for finding their own housing.

CODE OF CONDUCT AND ALCOHOL POLICY

Central Connecticut State University has a **no tolerance policy** regarding the consumption of alcohol or the use of drugs on campus. **It is forbidden to bring or consume alcohol in the residence halls, <u>regardless</u> <u>of age;</u> the same restriction applies to drugs. The automatic suspension of privileges, including housing, will result from a violation of the no tolerance policy.**

CCSU ID CARD

Go to <u>CCSU Card Office</u> to collect your CCSU Blue Chip Card. This card will be your personal keycard to your dorm, bathroom, and residence hall. <u>DO NOT</u> lose it. You will use your card to enter the Rec Center (gym), the dining halls, to pay for your laundry, and to purchase meals and snacks in Devils Den and other dining services on Campus.

All undergraduate students can pick up a U-PASS at the CCSU Card office which allows you to travel free on the train and bus in the State of Connecticut!

OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Driving in the U.S.

If you already have a foreign driver's license, you may be eligible to use it in the U.S. for one (1) year accompanied by an International Driver's Permit (IDP). If you want to obtain a CT driver's license, refer to our driver's license checklist.

Applying for a Social Security Number

F-1 and J-1 visa holders, with an offer of on-campus employment, are eligible to apply for a Social Security Number. Refer to our <u>Social Security Number Checklist</u>



Working in the U.S.

F-1 and J-1 students are eligible for on-campus employment only. Maximum 20hr/week during semesters and 40hr/week during breaks. For more information about work, refer to www.ccsu.edu/isss/workAuthorization

Obtaining a bank account

F-1 and J-1 students are eligible to open a checking and savings account in the U.S. More information will be provided during orientation.
