Applying for Admission

For consideration, applicants must submit the following:

1. A completed online application with supplemental materials (ccsu.edu/apply):
 - Three letters of recommendation attesting to your suitability as a prospective counselor
 - Essay describing your:
 - Reasons for entering the profession
 - Experiences that influenced your decision
 - Personal characteristics you believe will contribute to your success
2. Official undergraduate and graduate transcripts from a regionally accredited institution of higher education (GPA of 2.7 or higher)
