• Updated work to rectify electrical capacity issues in the Annex

- Media Center contract at AG's office, some refresh work to take place over Spring Break, remainder Summer 25
- Learning Commons
 - o Creation of Proscenium (H20 Media) space will require a tremendous amount of support
 - o Increased presence of Help Desk and On Site in this area (relocation at start of semester or just after)
 - o Adjacency to ITDRC
 - o Centralized support to different areas on campus
- Consultant investigation in Library to determine source of leaks in windows/parapet

• Computer Science request for student collaborative space/use as classroom. Furniture can be repurposed from Bassett Hall, however minor construction needed.

Copernicus Hall

- Work in 416 scheduled for summer, determine next set of labs for renovation
- CHRS wing expansion, potentially outer ring (Nursing in this area already)
- Health Education Clinic phase II-health simulation, assessment and meeting space

Memorial Hall

• Project underway, infrastructure updates (lighting, HVAC, grease traps, etc) to improve student dining experience

Willard DiLoreto Lobby

• Structural settling going on, evaluation by consultant to determine cause and potential repairs

Ed Advance

• Continued work on working with this group to create higher education path for their students

Carroll Hall

• Phase II Drop In Center-create experiential learning opportunities/small group instruction/multipurpose room (typically not found in pre school spaces)

Bichum Lab

- Working with legislature on funding for Forensics space
- Flume has been relocated to Copernicus Hall

Other

- Lock upgrades multiyear project to replace locks no longer supported
- KCATF event end Jan/Feb
- Geography/Anthropology departments will be merged and combined into one suite. Economics will be moving into Anthropology space
