About the Role:

Events may be in the evening, so the hours are flexible.

Responsibilities Include:

- Assisting with program coordination, a variety of marketing efforts, and basic office support.
- Assisting in the planning and developing of new events.
- Occasionally supporting other programs within the Professional Education department.

Preferred Criteria:

- The ideal candidate will have experience with office software such as Microsoft Office and marketing software, and the desire and willingness to learn additional programs.
- Experience in, or the ability to learn programs such as Excel, Constant Contact, Salesforce, and Microsoft Office/Outlook is necessary.

This position also requires flexibility in working hours. The incumbent in this position is not expected to work every event, but to support events and maintain relationships with the community.
